Club Operations

Fundraising

A club can't do projects if it doesn't fundraise, a big thankyou to the whole club for being involved. A number of friends have assisted over the year as well and the club is grateful for their help.

The weekly Hamilton Street sausage sizzles continued, and this year should raise about \$9,000. A lot of sausages were bought by the level crossing removal high viz vest workers. This year there was a price increase in line with Bunnings. Thanks to Breadstreet for the donation of bread and to the staff for cutting the onions each week. Many members assist on a Saturday morning but a huge thanks goes to the tongmasters Graeme Battersby, Rob Teese & Nigel Cooper.

Thanks to the local community for dropping the spare coins or notes in the donation tins at the sizzles and Breadstreet. Approx \$1,600 was collected.

The Whitehorse Farmers market continues each month and raises about \$7,000 for each club during the year.

The regular mince pies fundraiser had members assisting with baking, packing and selling again this year.

The Mont Albert Market commenced in August 2022 and although there have been a number of setbacks due to the train level crossing removals, we still believe the Market will become a popular place to be on the 4th Sunday of each month.

So far, we have had the "Free Stallholder Day" in September on the AFL long weekend and the "Australia Day Free Stallholder Day" in January 2023 on that long weekend. We also had the "Steam Train Day" in October. These themed Market days seemed to be a highlight and we have had good feedback from stallholders concerning these events.

Because of the blasting for the underground tunnels for the trains and the closing of Mont Albert & Union Roads the Market has had to be postponed for March, April & May.

We are looking forward to re-commencing the Market on Sunday June 25th.



Lift the Lid Walk for Mental Health

This is the third time this walk has been held. The club has a commitment of \$42,000 over 3 ½ years and are partnering with ARH and the St Kilda Football Club to fund a research scholarship. The Danny Frawley Centre PhD Scholarship has been awarded to Jordan Vella. PhD Project Title: *Exploring the Risk-Protective Factors for the Mental Health of Retired Elite Athletes*.

An initiative this year was to involve the local sporting groups which increased the number of walkers. The winner of the competition was the Surrey Hills Football Club. We look forward to more being involved next year. Thanks to Alex Starr and Rosie Starr and the team for organising this event.

We welcomed two new members this year Azita Malek as part of the Ross Hunt Corporate Membership and Tak Ooka.

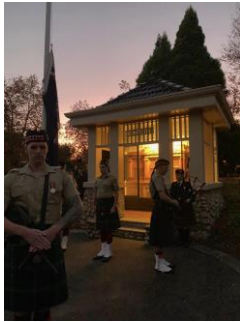
Unfortunately, Simon Barnard left the club. We thank him for his contribution over the years. As at 30 June 2023 there are 18 members.

Community



The club continued to support the Surrey Hills ANZAC Day Dawn Service held in Surrey Gardens. The Surrey Hills and Mont Albert Progress Association and the Surrey Hills Historical Association were also involved. Joe Somers, Graeme Battersby and Anne Teese represented MASH on the committee. The theme this year was 'Untold Stories of the Shrine'. David did a fantastic job as MC and as always, the students presented the stories well.

The End of an Era Steam Train was held on Sunday 23 October. Surrey Hills and Mont Albert Stations would become Union Station. It was a fantastic day with the steam train doing a number of trips. A great celebration with Hamilton Street closed off for the day. It was a community event supported by Surrey Hills and Mont Albert Progress Association. Due to the popularity of the event funds were raised and they will be used for the community area when the old Mont Albert Station building is returned to its glory.



International Women's Day – Wednesday 8th March – Organised by members of the Whitehorse Rotary Clubs and Whitehorse Rotaract, the International Women's Day breakfast was held at the Box Hill Town Hall. A fantastic morning with three inspiring guest speakers, Dr Helen Szoke, Hayley Dureau and Mikela Starfrace who spoke about equality. MASH sponsored three students, Isabella, Halle and Sophie plus teacher Glenda from Koonung Secondary College to attend. It is a great opportunity, and I am sure they all take something from the morning. Also attending from MASH, Val (organising committee), Alex (Ross Hunt table), Gill, Joe (on parking duties) and Anne (selling raffle tickets). Thanks also to Kai-Xing who assisted with marketing.

A donation of \$10,000 was made to 'You Matter' <https://www.youmatter.org.au/> You Matter supports women and families who have experienced family violence through the provision of furniture and other household items necessary to run a functional home.

MASH set up a RAWCS (RABS) project to support the Oneonetwelve Initiative (<https://www.oneonetwelve.org/>). The project will provide one person with a disability being managed by one dental practitioner for twelve months pro bono. Mina Borromeo is Hon. Associate Professor (Dentistry) for special needs dentistry at the University of Melbourne and the project will focus on dentists and patients in the southeast Melbourne region. The project will ensure that those persons with a disability approved by the programme are identified as needy and lacking the necessary funds to pay for their own dental health nor rely on the state dental health system.

The relationship with Carlisle Bay Primary School on the Island of Nendo in the Solomons that started back in 2020 simmers away. The club's support of Donations in Kind in Footscray allowed us to have 4 boxes of books sent to the Solomons recently.

Defying the Drift - MASH again sponsored the Defying the Drift Program (started by Rotarians at Rotary Club of Beaufort). It is a 3 day live in program for 16-18 year-old students providing them with options for staying in a rural location, personal development and the opportunity to connect with their peers. Graeme Battersby attended the program dinner at Longerenong College, Horsham and was once again inspired by the enthusiasm of the participants. We were lucky enough to have Dale, Tyla and Annabel attend the club in person and speak to us about the successful program.

Whitehorse Rotaract – MASH have a great relationship with the club. We have sponsored Alice Terrill as a leader and Matthew Gibney as a participant to attend RYLA this year.

We look forward to all those we have sponsored presenting to the club later in the year.

Both Rotaractors and Interactors helped at the Lift the Lid Walk for Mental Health in February. A number of MASH members also attended the Rotaract Giant Monopoly Night.

Foundation

The club was recognised this year for donating over US\$100,000 to foundation since MASH was chartered in 2004.

The club has once again donated to the Eradication of Polio – we are so close.

Rotary Rewards

A District 9810 initiative was to reward clubs for the work done this year. MASH members managed to accumulate enough points to be rewarded with Rotary hats, mugs and pens.

Rotary International Convention

The 2023 convention was held in Melbourne during May. Over 13,000 Rotarians from across the globe came together at Rod Laver Area and the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre to hear inspirational speakers, be entertained, be inspired, learn about projects in the House of Friendship and attend breakout sessions to hear about all things Rotary. Anne and Rob home hosted Sylvia Balungi Kiggundu from the Rotary Club of Needham in Boston. Sylvia is originally from Uganda.

Comment

Please note these accounts are just for the 11 months to 31.5.23 with the year-end accounts to 30.6.23 to be tabled at our AGM in November.

Despite our endeavours to expend funds by way of donations and project expenditure, we still finished the 11 months with total funds of \$39,990.70. It should be noted, however, that in June we will be distributing some \$7,500 to budgeted worthwhile causes leaving an approximate end of year balance of \$32,000. Of this, \$8,400 has been quarantined from the Steam Train project for a future project in connection with the Mont Albert Station and we have a commitment to Australian Rotary Health of \$9,186 to meet over the next 18 months in respect of the Lift the Lid project.

The Fundraising and Whitehorse Farmers' Market accounts show we raised \$62,946 and, of this, we donated \$41,627, with future commitments of another \$25000. This is an excellent result for a small club which continues to be a hard-working and successful team at raising funds.

This year we raised further monies for Australian Rotary Health and to date our two years of running the Lift the Lid walk/run at Deakin University has seen us, along with supporters' donations, raise \$32,814, well on the way to meeting the \$42,000 target by 31.12.25.

Our major areas of fundraising for the year were the Mont Albert Market, the Steam Train, Sausage Sizzles and donation tins, Mince Pies, Lift the Lid and Whitehorse Farmers' Market.

We withdrew \$2,576 from the Whitehorse Farmers' Market account to support community projects such as the Box Hill Scholarships, Koonung Citizenship Awards, the Primary School speech competition, and donations to Alkira and Eastern Emergency Relief. Further drawings of \$2,573 for Koonung Secondary College Alpine School and the Science Experience will be made prior to the year's end. Even so, the balance in the WFM account is still very healthy and it is recommended that we continue to seek other avenues of community service for the use of these funds.

Administration account

The main items of income for the Administration account were Membership fees (\$1,657), Changeover income (\$3,030) - this spanned two Changeovers in the year, and \$3,122 of incorrect deposits which were transferred to the Fundraising account.

On the Expenditure side, Rotary levies and RDU made up \$5,283, Centurion donations (\$800), the purchase of a new BBQ and Laptop (\$1,843), payment for Changeovers (\$2,556) and the reversal of the \$3,122 in funds to Fundraising as mentioned above.
